Mr. Brian Qian General Manager for The Hong Kong Great Wanda Company Limited, visited Southern University at Shreveport Workforce Development Department. Mr. Qian had constructive conversations with Dr. Galiotos focusing in the following areas:



- Student and faculty exchanges with represented ones in the People’s Republic of China
- Applied research projects
- Recruitment strategies and tactics of Chinese students to enroll in SUSLA programs, and cultural activities.

Mr. Qian’s company represents several Chinese industries in the Oil & Gas sector; China National Petroleum Corporation, Sinopec, China National Offshore Oil Corporation, Sinochem, Shandong Energy Group, and others.

Mr. Qian had exploratory conversations with Dr. Galiotos about possibilities for SUSLA to offer customized fast-track training and credentialing training in Oil & Gas operations (upstream, midstream, and downstream) as well as safety best practices in that sector.

Power Engineering Technology, partnership with PanGlobal, and related certifications by NIULPE were also part of the main exploratory discussions.

Hunger Free Campus Grant Award

Act 719 of the 2022 Regular Legislative Session, authored by Baton Rouge State Representative Barbara Freiberg, established criteria for Louisiana higher education institutions to earn the Hunger-Free Campus designation and authorized the Hunger-Free Campus competitive grant program to support the institutions in their efforts.

In 2023, all Louisiana public postsecondary and four private postsecondary institutions met the minimum requirements to receive the designation, including Southern University at Shreveport.

To enact the charge of the legislation, the Board of Regents awarded six Louisiana public postsecondary institutions \$8,000 each to support the Hunger-Free Campus Initiative at their institutions. Southern University at Shreveport is an award recipient and will use the grant funds to address mid-month hunger and emergency food needs, offer personal hygiene products, and provide food for students with specific dietary needs.

The grant will also support the purchase of much-needed equipment to operate Jaguar Junction, our food pantry. The SUSLA Hunger-Free Campus Committee members are Dr. Michael Anderson, Ms. Sonya Hester, Dr. Joslin Pickens, Ms. Sharmain Talbert, Ms. Brenda Henderson, and Dr. Lonnie McCray.

Workforce Development: BP X Energy TechScholars Onshore Training Program

Southern University at Shreveport participated in the inaugural BP X Energy TechScholars Onshore Training program represented by three graduating students from the SUSLA Process Technology program: Taliayah Parker, Austin Stewart, and Jaden Martin. Dr. John K. Galiotos served as Faculty attaché and advisor representing Southern University at Shreveport. This pioneering initiative, organized by BP X Energy, aimed to promote careers in onshore operations and attract talent from relevant programs operating at select community colleges.

The training took place in Shreveport, Louisiana from April 1 to April 4, 2024. Our students distinguished themselves early on for their collaborative spirit, effective communication, solid knowledge base, practical skills, and unwavering enthusiasm for the program. They were also commended for their supportive role in assisting their fellow scholars throughout the training.

Southern University at Shreveport can take pride in its Process Technology and Petroleum Engineering Technology faculty. Their passion, dedication, resilience, and relevant qualifications have positively impacted our students' education and training. The cohort consisted of 17 students specializing in Process Technology and Instrumentation Technology, accompanied by three dedicated instructors. The participating institutions included Southern University at Shreveport, Lone Star College (Houston, Texas), and San Juan Community College (Farmington, New Mexico). The BPX Energy TechScholars had the opportunity to visit BPX Energy and Kinder-Morgan onshore gas field operating and producing assets in Haynesville, as well as Hydraulic Fracturing (Fracking) operations in the same region.

The training also included mock interviews, resume writing, advising sessions by BPX Energy midstream leadership, career explorations and pathways with BP after graduation, and continuous safety best practices and updates. Further enhancing their knowledge, the students, instructors, and BPX-Energy Team visited the NE Texas Oil Museum in Kilgore, Texas.

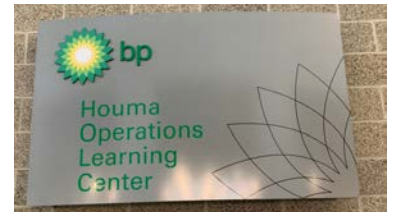
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They were also commended for their supportive role in assisting their fellow scholars throughout the training. The cohort consisted of 17 students specializing in Process Technology and Instrumentation Technology, accompanied by three dedicated instructors. The participating institutions included Southern University at Shreveport, Lone Star College (Houston, Texas), and San Juan Community College (Farmington, New Mexico). Upon completing the Process Simulations training, all students successfully passed their Water Survival Skills examinations, earning the OPITO/Maersk THUET Sea Survival CA-EBS industry certification. This certification, endorsed by OPITO, is recognized by the global offshore industry for the next four years, providing essential safety training for personnel working in offshore oil and gas operations.

Southern University System Representatives Participate in Spring 2024 eLearning Task Force Professional Development

On May 17, 2024, representatives from the Southern University System converged in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, for the spring 2024 eLearning Task Force Professional Development event. Organized by the eLearning Task Force committee for the Board of Regents, the gathering aimed to foster advancements in online learning strategies.



Melinda Roberts Perry, SUNO Executive Online Director, highlighted the collaborative nature of the conference, emphasizing its significance in the advancement of online education in Louisiana. Dr. Veronica McEachin, Associate Vice Chancellor of Academic Innovations/Director of E-Learning at Southern University at Shreveport, echoed this sentiment as one of the Southern University System attendees. Notably, Dr. McEachin serves on the E-Learning task committee for the Board of Regents, underscoring the commitment of the Southern University System to enhance online education statewide. Joining her were representatives from the Southern University System from left to right - Tyquencia Parker, Interim Director for the SUSLA Connect Program; Joyce Cottonham, (SUSLA) Associate Professor of English; Dr. Cheryl D. Blackshire, (SUSLA) Assistant Professor for Nursing/Clinical Coordinator; Melinda Roberts Perry, SUNO Executive Online Director; Dr. Yolander Smith, (SUBR) Interim Director of SU Online/LAABSET Corporate and Community Liaison/Project Manager - DXC Partnership and Top Jags Campus Advisor; Barbara Woods, (SUBR) Technology Manager for CANVAS; Gwendolyn Tennell, (SUSLA) Assistant Director of E-Learning/LMS administrator; and Colton Wiggins, (SUSLA) Director of the Polysomnography Technology Program.



During the eLearning Task Force Professional Development event, Mr. Colton Wiggins, Director of the Polysomnography Technology Program at Southern University at Shreveport (SUSLA), not only delivered a presentation titled "Streamlining Presentation & Assessment Creation for eLearning" but also left feeling immensely inspired about the future of online learning. Mr. Wiggins' session offered practical guidance, highlighting how educators can leverage online technologies and proven eLearning practices to

streamline the development of high-quality instructor resources. He further sparked discussions on how online technologies and Artificial Intelligence (AI) can be harnessed to facilitate the onboarding of new instructors transitioning from the workforce to higher education.

As a first-time attendee and breakout session speaker, Mr. Wiggins found the data presented at the event particularly motivating. The data highlighted a surge in demand for online programs and courses. Students are increasingly seeking affordable and flexible options to pursue valuable certificates and degrees. This trend positions the Southern University System exceptionally well to become a leader in online education. The university's exceptional eLearning and IT departments, working hand-in-hand with faculty, are continuously improving our online presence; ensuring students have access to high-quality educational opportunities.

Joyce Cottonham, an Associate Professor of English, emphasized during her participation in the E-Learning Conference in Baton Rouge, the significant impact Artificial Intelligence (AI) is poised to have on the future landscape of higher education and adult learning. AI stands as a burgeoning trend capable of reshaping traditional educational paradigms. Through personalized and interactive learning experiences, AI holds the promise of revolutionizing higher education, while simultaneously providing valuable insights and support to students and educators alike.

The participation of Southern University System representatives in this event underscores the commitment to advancing eLearning initiatives and fostering collaboration among institutions within the system.

The Investiture of Chancellor Aubra J. Gantt, Ed.D.

The Investiture Ceremony for Dr. Aubra Jeanette Gantt as the eighth leader of Southern University at Shreveport (SUSLA) was held Thursday, April 18, at 7:00 PM at the Shreveport Convention Center. Gathering to witness this first-ever investiture ceremony and reception for the Shreveport campus were presidents and chancellors from more than 10 colleges and universities; the Southern University System Board of Supervisors; federal, state, and local elected officials; students; alumni; faculty; staff; family; community leaders and friends. Higher education investiture ceremonies are traditionally held within the first year of a new leader's tenure. Dr. Gantt began her service in July 2023, making history as the first female chancellor at the Shreveport campus.



Dr. Gantt was presented to a capacity-filled audience of nearly 400 by her mentor, Dr. Ray L. Belton, the 10th President/Chancellor of the Southern University System and the Sixth Chancellor of Southern University at Shreveport. Dr. Belton's introduction chronicled Dr. Gantt's higher education path to the chancellor's position. He said, "Upon meeting her as a young professional, I recognized her spark of energy, her drive to perform with excellence, and her grit to finish the task once begun. Today, those qualities have defined her as a consummate professional."

During the formal investiture ceremony, The Oath of Office was administered by The Honorable Carl E. Stewart, United States Circuit Judge, United States Court of Appeals Fifth Judicial Circuit. The Honorable Dennis Shields, President of the Southern University System, presented Dr. Gantt with the university mace, which is a symbol of the Office of the Chancellor. To complete her official university regalia, SU System Board members The Honorable Zazell Dudley and The Honorable Sam Gilliam draped Dr. Gantt with the Chancellor's hood and the chain of office, respectively. The handcrafted chain bears a medallion with SUSLA's seal. Additionally, the names of SUSLA's eight chancellors are engraved on small plates along the chain of office.

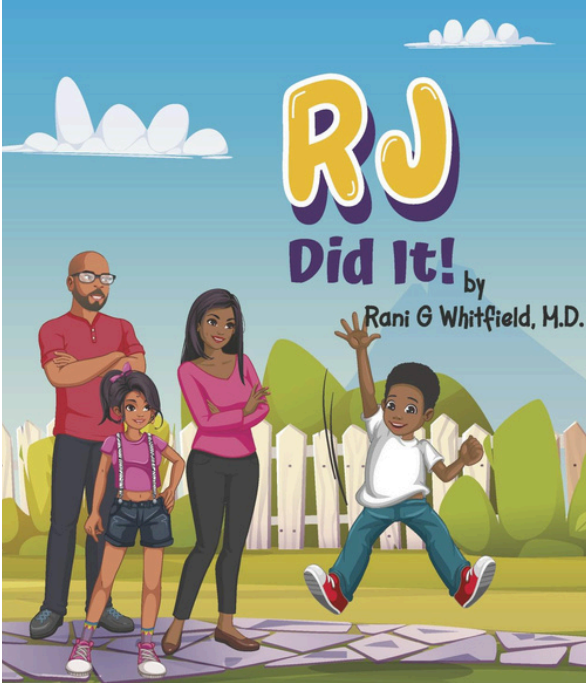
